

Pastoral letter

Dear friends.

Happy Easter! May the peace and joy of the risen Lord fill us with new hope and courage.

The season of Easter will continue for most of May leading onto Ascension Day (on 26 May) and Pentecost (on 5 June). At the heart of the Gospel resurrection stories are encounter with the risen Jesus and the commission to go and tell. For those first disciples the resurrection of Jesus was not an abstract truth or act of remarkable faith, it was an overwhelming and shocking experience. Their grief was turned to joy, their failure turned to new courage, their doubts overcome by the reality of Christ alive. Jesus greets them with the words 'Peace be with you' and their lives are transformed. From that experience the church was born, and this is something we return to again and again as we encounter Christ anew in scripture, sacrament, prayer, conversation and loving service. I encourage you to use this season of Easter to come back to that foundational experience – the presence and peace of the risen Lord. Why not read the different resurrection stories at the end of the four gospels (and the

15th chapter of Paul's letter to the Corinthians) and allow the words to sink deep within you? 'That Christ is risen; he is risen indeed!'

Christ is alive! No longer bound to distant years in Palestine, But saving, healing, here and now And touching every place and time.

The encounter leads to action. The risen Jesus invites his disciples to be his witnesses, promising them the Spirit to empower and guide them, sending them out in his name. John's Gospel pictures this as Jesus saying to the disciples, 'As the Father sent me, so I send you' and breathing his Spirit into them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit.' This is then underlined with a story of fishing, which is clearly more about fishing for people than fish and the challenge to Pater to care for the sheep.

Faith has to be active in love, the experience of the love of Christ has to communicated and shared. So I encourage you to use this season of Easter to do something for God, be it speaking of your faith to another person or helping someone in need or campaigning for change in our society. Christianity has to be lived – faith with our action is dead.

There of opportunities to do this this month as the churches of our area take part in Christian Aid Week ((15-21 May) and Love Wycombe, a mission initiative that extends across the whole of this corner of Buckinghamshire. The campaign has three prongs:

- prayer for our neighbourhoods, street by street (from 8 May)
- □ social action for the good of our neighbours, which for our two churches is going to involve litter picks (on 7 and 15 May).
- A central act of worship and witness at the Guildhall in High Wycombe on 12 June (which will take the place of our morning worship at Trinity and to which members of Cores End are also invited, even though we will be holding our normal service there)

Before that we celebrate Ascension Day (on 26 May) that begins 10 days of prayer for those yet to know the love of Christ for themselves, a global and ecumenical initiative – 'Thy Kingdom come'. That leads onto Pentecost Sunday on 5 June which corresponds with the Queen's Jubilee. As part of that Cores End will be holding a tea (hopefully in the grounds) and songs of praise at 4 pm that Sunday (do put it in your diaries).

Christ sends us out – invites us to open the doors and get out there. That outward direction of movement is critical to the life of the church, just like breathing in and out is essential for our lives. 'The Church exists by mission, just as fire exists by burning.' (Emil Brunner) May that fire burn bright in the month ahead.

Happy Easter! May the love of the risen Lord inspire us once more.

LENT 2022 Jars of Change



THANK YOU FOR DONATIONS

Link to Hope continue to help people who are affected by the Ukraine crisis, regardless of colour, creed, religion or nationality. Their work is focussed on 3 key areas:

- Helping refugees to escape Ukraine
- Helping refugees who have escaped Ukraine and gone to Romania & Moldova
- Sending in humanitarian aid sourced locally into Ukraine.

£310 has recently been sent from Cores End URC to Link to Hope to support their efforts. The charity has been working among the poorest communities in Ukraine for many years (and both churches support its Shoebox Appeal.)

DEC Ukraine Appeal: The Disasters Emergency Committee is a coalition of over 15 aid organisations (including Christian Aid). Their appeal will be matched pound for pound by donations from the UK Government's previously allocated funds. Trinity sent £130 in April and more donations are welcome. LET'S NOT FORGET THE OTHER PLACES OF CONFLICT AND INJUSTICE

Council for World Mission March 2022

As we've journeyed towards the death and triumphant resurrection of Christ, Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand, Moderator Right Rev Hamish Galloway encourages us to navigate pandemic-related tension, temptation and taunts with resilience; while Yonsei university Korea lecturer Sigamoney Shakespeare's Ash Wednesday reflection calls on us to stand in fearless solidarity with the vulnerable, emboldened by our vulnerable God.



Presbyterian Church in Taiwan statement on the war in Ukraine: Has released an open letter addressing the war in Ukraine on the 75th anniversary of the February 28 massacre, which was an anti-government uprising met with violet suppression in Taiwan. Knowing full well from experience that authoritarian governments and dictators do not represent the hearts of its people.

Protestant Church in the Netherlands organises live broadcast of Prayer for Ukraine: The Netherlands organised a time of prayer for Ukraine in the Domkerk in Utrecht on Ash Wednesday. This prayer for peace and justice in Ukraine was broadcast live by KRONCRV, a Dutch public broadcasting company, and led by Rev Rene de Reuver, General Secretary.

Church of South India General Secretary's Message: C. Fernanda's Rathina Raja has exhorted church members to work towards unity and compassion in his message in a recent issue of CSI Life. In the editorial, he wrote about moving forward towards a fuller communion of faith and love, with respect for legitimate theological and liturgical variety.

Time of Repentance and Renewal: Vulnerability of God invites for repentance, communion in solidarity and resistance with the vulnerable communities and nature by Sigamoney Shakespear, the word Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon Lencten meaning Spring. Traditionally believers spend a lot of time meditating, fasting, and praying during lent. Some church traditions emphasise fasting and sharing with the poor.

Statement of the Racial Justice Advocacy Forum on Racial discrimination amidst invasion of Ukraine: Calls for coverage, prayer and action for people facing racial discrimination amidst the invasion of Ukraine. The Racial Justice Advocacy Forum condemns the invasion of Ukraine, it is deeply saddened by the loss of life. The destruction of homes and businesses.

eDARE 2022 Call for proposals: Current international crises e.g. the invasion of Ukraine, the war against Tigray, the military coup of Myanmar- on top of the ongoing global crises due to poverty and hunger, unfair distribution of wealth and resources, the Covid pandemic, climate change, among others – underscore the need for liberation. CWM thus invites your contribution.

CWM organises World Day of Prayer 2022 in solidarity with Myanmar and Ukraine: gathered more than 100 participants from CWM member churches and ecumenical partners worldwide for a time of prayer and to stand in solidarity with our sisters and brothers in Myanmar and Ukraine. Held virtually in March, the timely prayer and sharing session organised by the CWM East.

Hot meals for school children in Madagascar: A catastrophic food crisis in Southern Madagascar which faced its worst drought in 40 years, has pushed over a million people to starvation. Money for Madagascar, the UK based charity administers the money raised by the Union.

Online kids chapel by Church of South India South Kerala Diocese: Church of South Kerala Diocese launched a new online worship platform for children last year, inaugurated by the mod Rev A Dharmaraj Rasalam, Bishop in South Kerala Diocese. The initiative by the board for Christian Education uses child friendly liturgy to provide spiritual learning experience for children.

All charities that wish to continue holding online or telephone meetings of trustees should check that their governing document allows them to do so.

This could be relevant to any members of the congregation with trustee's responsibilities (eg Elders).

The Wye Connect School of Cookery



Preparation time: 10 minutes Cooking time: 5 - 6 minutes

225g SR flour Pinch of salt 1 tsp mixed spice 50g margarine 50g lard 80g castor sugar 75g sultanas / currants

1 large egg (lightly beaten)

Rub the fats, salt and flour together to make fine breadcrumbs. Add the sugar and fruit and mix well. Pour in the egg and mix to a softish dough. (Do not overwork.)

Roll out on a floured surface – 5mm thick. Cut out and griddle on a medium heat for 4 minutes each

side. Once cooked dust with a little castor sugar and eat warm.

(Add some ground cinnamon to the sugar to give the cakes a little something extra!)

Thames North Synod Environmental Policy 2022 GOOD NEWS!

Three resolutions were passed overwhelmingly at the March Synod:

- 1. THE ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY: As part of its strategy to implement the URC Environmental Policy and to respond to the growing climate and ecological crisis, Thames North Synod meeting on 26 March 2022, adopts the Thames North Synod Environmental Policy 2022, a copy of which is now online at https://urc.org.uk/your-church/church-local-and-global/become-an-eco-church-or-congregation/ If you want to see a paper copy contact Terry
- 2. IMPLEMENTATION: Synod asks all local churches and their members, together with Synod bodies throughout Thames North, to identify actions that they can take to implement the policy. It is good that both our churches are progressing as Eco Churches as this is a crucial part of the strategy to implement, but there is still much to do, especially in the areas of buildings and lifestyles. Synod committee and groups are being asked to consider how they can support local churches and help them to move the carbon zero and to make positive impacts on the environment.
- 3. GREEN APOSTLES: Synod appoints Terry Hinks, Peter Skerratt, Jill Nugent and Maggie Hindley to be Synod Green Apostles to (with as outlined at the Synod held 20 March 2021) to promote the Environmental Policy. They will be part of team with others involved in supporting the work. They have met and are focusing work initially on making contact with churches, finding someone who will act as a local church advocate in this, seeing 'where churches are at' in terms of their care for God's creation and encouraging all to become part of the eco church programme.

You are called to stand with the lost and broken. You are called to establish God's values throughout the earth. Spirit of God, breathe on us again, That we might hear, see and build a shared life.
