Pastoral letter

Dear friends,

Well, it was a scorcher! Even the start of the school holidays didn't bring rain, even though it has come in recent days. September may remain warm – an 'Indian summer' is always possible, but in time summer will drift into autumn – the season of mellow fruitfulness.

Much of the harvest is in, but perhaps some apples are yet to be picked and vegetables that have survived the extreme heat. The seasons have become blurred and erratic in recent years due in part to climate change, but we still have a harvest for which to give thanks at our harvest festivals later in September (18th at Trinity and 25th at Cores End).

I love the seasons and hope that we can continue to enjoy that movement between them, even though we also know that in this island nation sometimes we can experience all four seasons in one day!

The famous passage from Ecclesiastes begins with the words: 'For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven'. September marks four special seasons in our life as Christian communities:

The Season of Creation runs from 1 September to 4 October (St Francis' Day) and involves Christians of many different backgrounds across the world. It is an opportunity to reflect on our relationship to the whole created order and our responsibility to all who share this planet with us. This year the theme is 'listening to creation', challenging us to really take notice of wildlife around us and to take seriously the cries of the natural world. How will you listen to nature, recognising God's hand in creation?

The Season of Invitation began as 'Back to Church Sunday' in 2004, which was an annual opportunity for churches across the UK and abroad to invite people to come with them to church. It then evolved into a longer period of invitation, using the festivals of harvest, remembrance and Christmas. It has slipped into the background but remains a good reminder that the autumn is a great opportunity to invite someone to come to a church event with you, whether they have been to church before or not. Also, following on from all the upheaval of the last few years, we need to reach out to those who no longer come to church. Who will you invite?

A Season of Thanksgiving focusses on our harvest festivals and 'all good gifts around us'. This harvest both churches are remembering again those who are struggling to feed themselves or their families. We'll be responding to the Christian Aid East Africa Hunger Crisis Appeal, as millions in nations of that area face famine and water shortages, following the worst drought in forty years. We'll also collect produce for the One Can Foodbank, helping people in our local area facing financial crisis together with food and fuel poverty. How can we help banish hunger?

The new school year as children change classes or schools, go to college or university. Their new beginnings challenge us all whatever our age or abilities to consider what new beginning we want to make in our lives – and what new beginning God wants to make in our lives and the life of the church. As we celebrate fifty years in the life of the United Reformed Church (formed on 5 October 1972) we remember our church's desire to help bring unity to the whole Christian Church and its 'right and readiness' to change. What change is needed in our church, nationally, regionally and locally? How can we better live out God's vision of a world transformed, but grace and peace, love and hope?

May this be a fruitful season in our lives as individuals and communities. Terry

TRINITY CHURCH VISION 2022 The foundation framework

As small groups work on the actions agreed by church meeting, it is good to be reminded of the foundational framework the Vision Group developed.

1. Partnerships

Where possible and appropriate, we will work with others to refresh and sustain our worship, foster discipleship and serve the community. Our partnership with other churches is part of our URC commitment to affirm, work and pray for Christian unity. Our partnership with other organisations reflects common goals of love and care for our neighbour, near and far.

2. Outward-looking

We will use the physical, practical and spiritual gifts and skills we have to serve and support our local neighbourhoods and communities, and more widely through the charities we support.

3. Worshipping Community

Everything we do, and everything we are, flows from our worship, joy, and love for God and God's love for us, our neighbour and our world, revealed in Jesus Christ and at work through the Holy Spirit.

4. Discipleship

We want to help everyone have the opportunity to encounter God, develop their faith and be builders of God's kingdom.

5. Communication

We want to be better at promoting who we are, what God offers and what we offer through God, in the most appropriate and effective ways.

6. Focus

We want, as a congregation, to have a shared, agreed focus on what we should do or not do, based on our understanding of what God is calling us to at this time and in this place – doing what we can, not trying to do what we can't. Our motto is crawl, walk, run!

7. Buildings

We want to give people a good welcoming experience as they come to the building, and to use the building to its best advantage in serving the church and wider community, in ways that are sustainable both for the environment and for our capacity to maintain and manage it.

8. Location

We want to maximise and promote the opportunities that our prominent location gives us, with available parking, bus stops, position opposite The Rye, and within walking distance of the town centre.

At the September Church Meeting Terry will suggest we add two more:

9. Environment

We recognise our responsibility to care for God's creation and respond to the environmental crises facing humanity and the planet today.

10. Undergirded with prayer

We give thanks for the way God has led and guided us, as we have sought this vision for Trinity. Prayer undergirds all that we do, both as a way of seeking and discerning God's will and expressing our loving concern for individuals and the world at large.

Wycombe Refugee Partnership

Wycombe Homeless Connection

Wycombe Homeless Connection wants to see suitable, affordable, secure housing for everyone in our area. It is concerned about the latest plans to extend right to buy to housing association properties because if this scheme is anything like the right to buy scheme for council housing, it may well lead to less social or affordable housing being available from housing associations in our area. This is because hardly any homes which have been sold under the council houses scheme have been replaced. It also raises difficult questions about the status of housing associations which are charities who are independent of the government. It's somewhat surprising to hear the government announce that they will be forced to sell off some of their most important assets. Are our local housing associations really independent charities which exist to provide affordable housing to people in our communities who need it, or are they not? That will now have to be cleared up too and it's not the first time this question has been raised. Staff and Trustees value your prayers and support as they respond to issues like these. Council for World Mission

CWM Appoints three senior leadership staff: After being approved with unanimous consensus by the Board of Directors who met in June, the General Secretary Rev Dr Jooseop Keum, is pleased to announce that Mr Sudipta Singh, Rev. Dr Young-Cheol Cheon and Rev. Daimon Mkandawire are appointed senior leaderships. The Council is also pleased to congratulate Rev. Dr Peter Cruchley, Mission Secretary, as Director of the World Council of Churches on World Mission and Evangelism.



The United Church of Zambia: Lusaka Presbytery's shift from traditional methods of mobilising church funds for mission, it has launch Umodzi Investments, a newly registered company to spearhead all its investment activities. Bishop Rev. Dr Lordwell Siame spoke about the church's need to expand.

From Death to Life Sunday 3rd July. Fourth Sunday after Pentecost Scripture: Psalm 30 Reflection There are moments in our lives when we feel desperate and hopeless. Our faiths are always shaken, by the many challenges we face in this world.

10 July: So Visible Yet Unseen-In Agony Yet Unheard Of: Fifth Sunday after Pentecost Scripture 10: 25-37, Matthew 25: 31-46. Reflection The Good Samaritan is one story that has been read over the ages by Christians and the more it is told the more we take its meaning for granted.

GEM School grounds economic justice biblically: The first face-to-face GEM School held since 2019 has opened in Berlin, Germany, with a focus on ecological and feminist economics. The GEM School is a program within the New International Financial and Economic Architecture project.

Church of South India organises medical camps: South India's Synod, its Department of Mission and Evangelism jointly organised a free Medical Camp at St Martins Church late last year. Over 200 people including missionaries in South Kerala Diocese and their families benefitted from the event.

CWM Sunday 2022 Worship resource now available: Worship is the heart of our missional vocation. For CWM 45th Anniversary Sunday this year, we have crafted worship resources to enable member churches to participate in worship which reflects on CWM Mission themes. The theme 'displacement and trauma' highlights the reality of many contexts around the word. The war in Ukraine and the ongoing Israeli-Palestinian concerns.

Sunday with CWM 17th **July – Be still and know that I am**: Sixth Sunday after Pentecost Scripture: Luke 10: 38-42. The gospel reading this week takes us to Bethany and to the home of Martha, Mary and Lazarus. Jesus didn't have a home, and Bethany would have been a safe and comfortable place where he could rest and relax with friends.

Sundays with CWM 24 July Liberating Gomer: Seventh Sunday after Pentecost Scripture: Hosea 1: 2-10 Reflection during many world atrocities women continue to suffer in the hands of men. Many actions have been taken to stop this prejudice. I believe one of the most contributing factors to the mistreatment of women in our societies today is our interpretation of biblical matters.

First Two Women ministers ordained in Tuvalu: In a historic moment for Tuvalu, two women, Rev. Oliula Kalahati and Rev. Sulufaiga Uota were ordained as ministers in special ceremonies on the 16th July. They join 41 ministers in EKT's parishes, and this comes more than a century after missionaries arrived in Tuvalu under the London Missionary Society.





Beware phone calls from 'your bank' after receiving fake texts

Scammers will initially cast their nets wide, sending thousands of fake text messages seemingly from legitimate companies. But for some, that's just the start of the con, as we found victims can often suffer a secondary hit from the same criminals.

This one-two jab can be highly effective for fraudsters. They use the initial bogus text to establish trust, and at times, even the caller ID has been spoofed to make it look like your bank's genuine phone number. Read more about this type of scam.

7 pension scams to watch out for

The Pensions Regulator says there is a greater risk of pensions scams right now as people who are struggling could be more susceptible to fake promises of early pension access or higher investment returns.

There are seven common types of pension scams. Make sure you know what to look out for.

Fake Emirates WhatsApp message

Random WhatsApp messages that claim to be from a large reputable brand are usually a scam and links included in the messages can install malware onto your device or phish for your personal information. The fake Emirates WhatsApp message advertises a link where you can 'win' a free holiday.

Always check the brand's official website and social media pages to verify the information in the message. <u>View our screenshots of a typical WhatsApp message scam</u>.

Currys email giveaway

New phishing emails impersonating the well-known electrical retailer Currys offer you the chance to win a free Smeg kettle. The email contains a dodgy link leading to a website where you're asked to complete a survey about your shopping habits and pay a delivery fee to receive the 'free' kettle. **Find out how to spot and avoid this scam**.

Blackmail and sextortion emails

Reports have spiked in recent weeks of people receiving emails threatening to expose personal information about them if money isn't transferred. Scammers typically claim they've hacked your device and then detail your personal information, such as your usernames and passwords, threatening to expose your data unless you transfer money to them.

If you receive an email like this, don't panic. That's exactly what the scammers want and it's likely nothing will come of it. But here's what you can do if you receive one and <u>how to check if your email address or password has been compromised.</u>

Fake energy refund emails circulating again

We sent out a warning about this in May, but it's back and doing the rounds. With tomorrow's energy price cap announcement, please be cautious of any energy emails appearing in your inbox.

The Government has announced that the Marriage and Civil Partnership (Minimum Age) Act 2022 will be brought into effect on Monday 27 February 2023. 16- and 17-year-olds will no longer be able to marry or enter a civil partnership in England and Wales under any circumstances, including with parental or judicial consent, from 26 February 2023.

The Wye Connect Kitchen



Also known as:

Drop scones Pikelets Scotch pancakes

- 3 tablespoons self-raising flour
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 egg 2 tablespoons sunflower oil one third of a cup of milk and water (equal portions milk and water do NOT be tempted to use milk only) all switched together

Add the wet ingredients to the dry and mix.

Spoon onto a hotplate or griddle - enough to form a circle of about $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 inches in diameter. Cook until bubbles appear and turn over before they burst.

Rumour has it that these will freeze well, but this assumes they are not all consumed hot off the griddle!

Tales from the Choirmaster

One Sunday the vicar of St. John's - a keen abstainer - preached that all beer and spirits should be thrown into the river. The choir then sang lustily: 'SHALL WE GATHER AT THE RIVER
